Library Profile

The St. Paul Municipal Library serves the community of the Town and County of St. Paul.

The library offers various resources and services such as printing, laminating, faxing, 3D printing, exam invigilation, meeting room/equipment rental, online resources, audiovisual collection, and expansive fiction and non-fiction collections for children, teens, and adults. St. Paul area is a Francophone community with multiple Indigenous communities nearby; the library has expanded to have French and Indigenous book collections.

The library has adapted to the current pandemic restrictions and has moved its programs online. The library also offers curbside services for those immunocompromised or unable to wear masks.

St. Paul Municipal Library' mission is as follows:

“The Staff and volunteers of the St. Paul Municipal Library will provide literacy-related services and programs to our community.”

Community Needs Assessment

On November 9, 2021, the library conducted a community needs assessment with the help of the Community Development Unit. After a thorough examination and discussion of our community's needs, strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats, the community members picked six service priorities from eighteen library service responses.

Using the data from the community needs assessment, the Town of St. Paul Library Board met on December 9th and 10th to discuss the findings from the needs assessment. They chose service priorities and goals based on it.

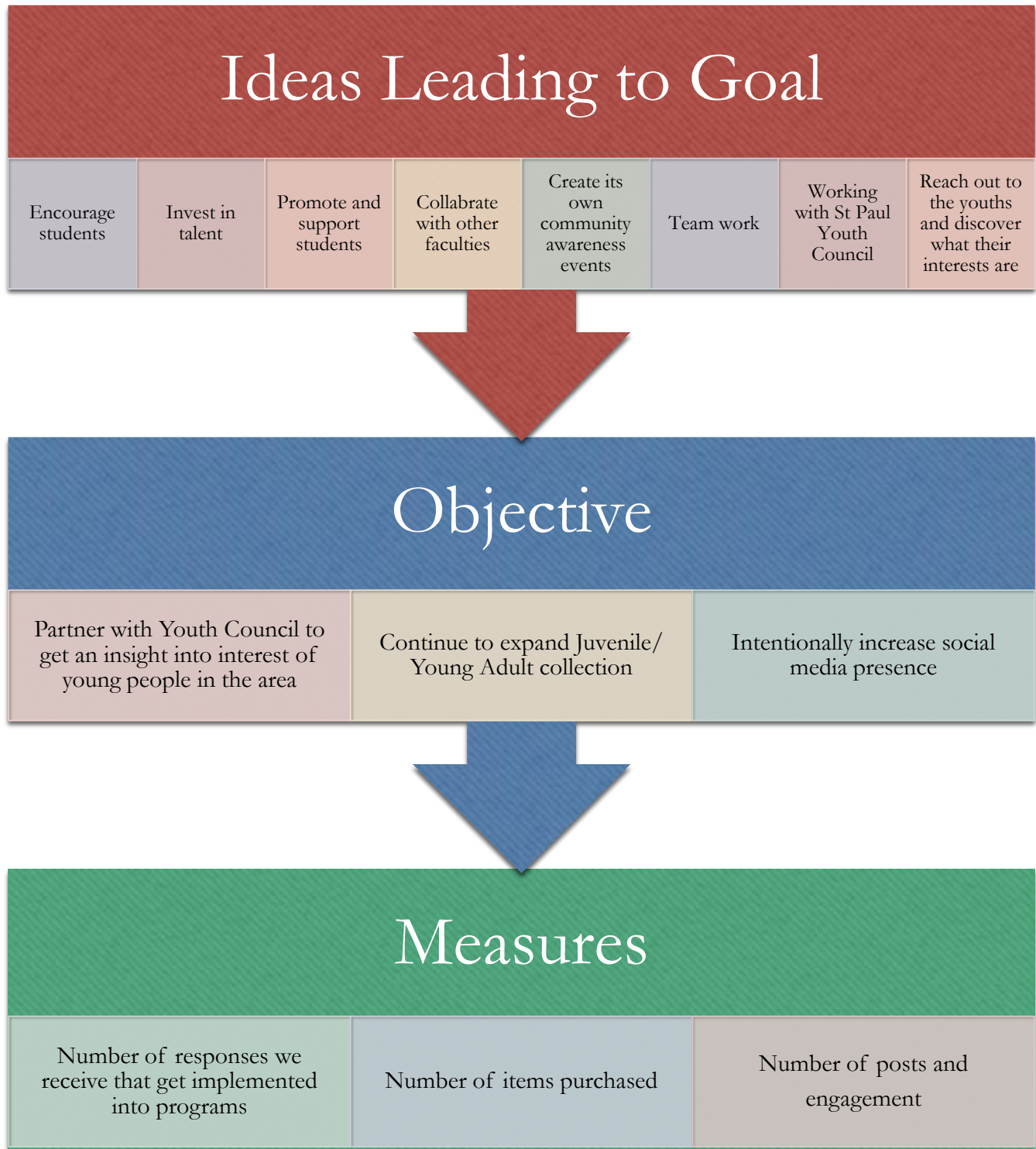

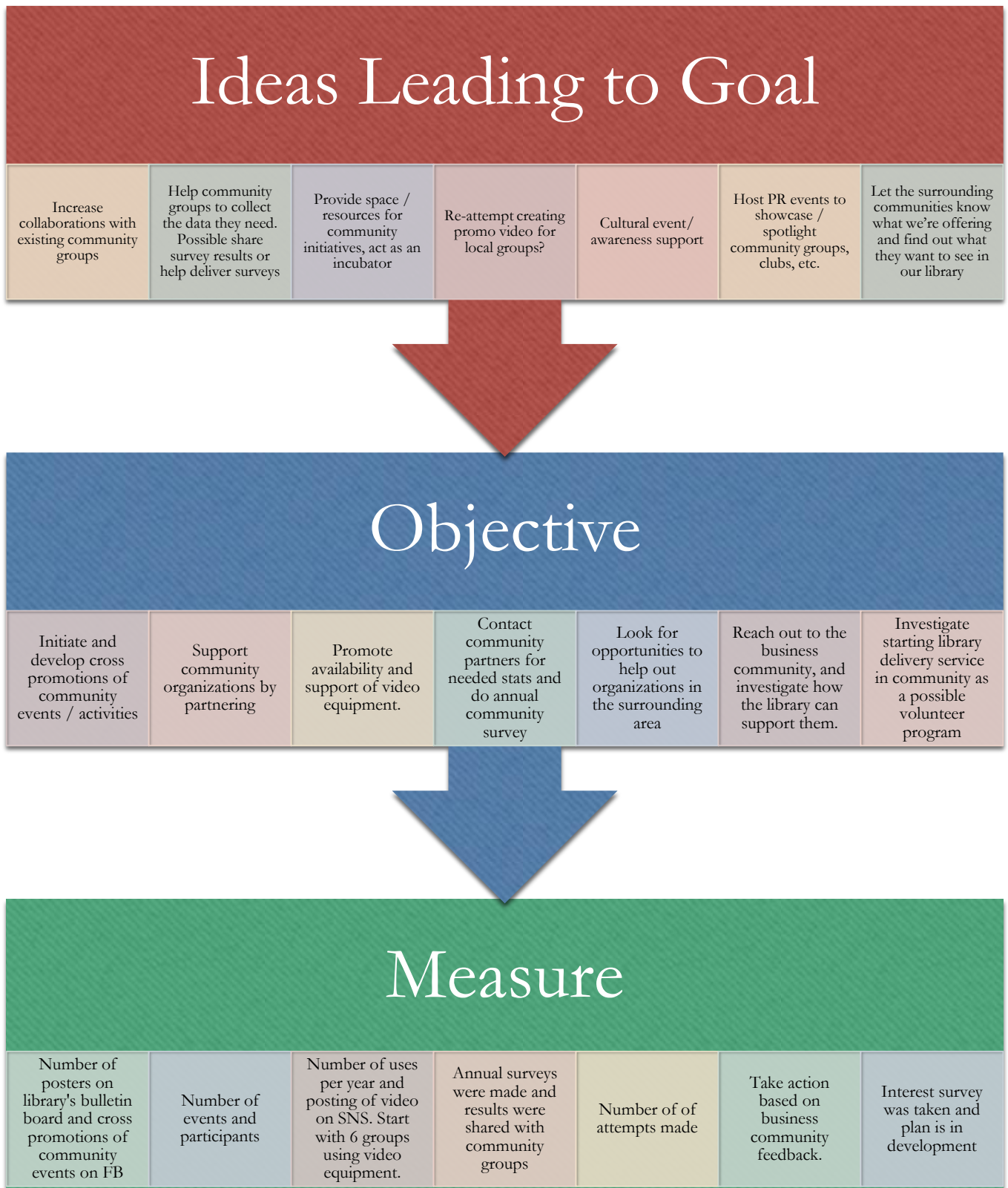
Goal 1. Provide education and programs for members of community



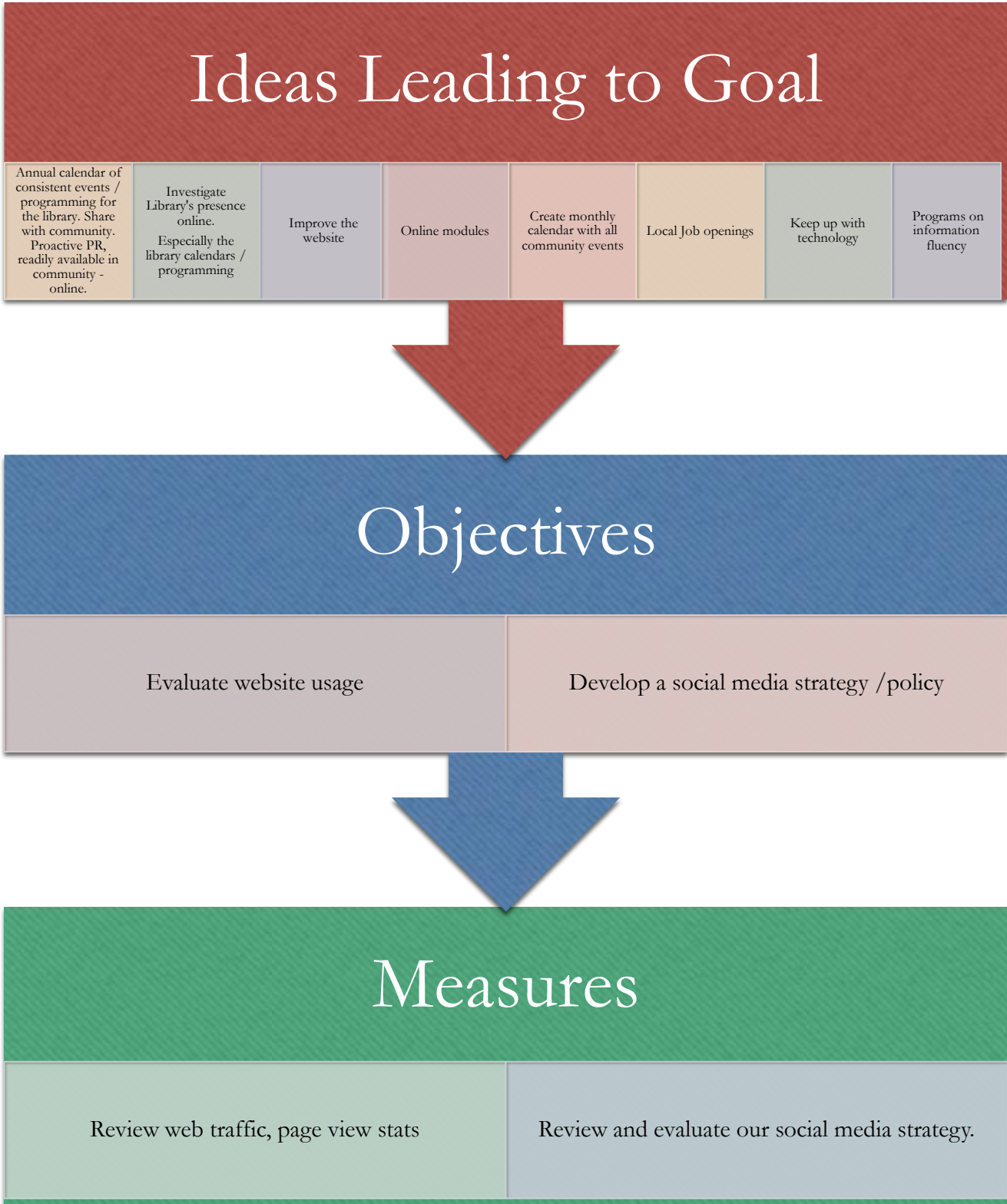
Goal 2. Provide programs and services focused on youth and children
